\*\*There will be no music competitions this year. With the shortened week and a new camp, we want to see how things go this year before we add that big of an undertaking. Our intent is not to end the competition permanently but, figure out the best way to begin to implement it again in the coming years.

We will, however, still have the Bible Quiz and the teaching and preaching competitions this year.

\*\*Bible Quiz will have 5 people per team and each church is allowed a max of 2 teams. It will consist of questions from the book of II Timothy.

\*\*Teaching will be for Jr and Sr High ladies. (Please remember to bring 4 judging forms for judges)

\*\*Preaching will be for Jr and Sr high guys. (Please remember to bring 4 judging forms and outlines for judges)

\*\*Also included in the cost of camp this year will be opportunities to enjoy ziplining, bubble ball soccer and paintball.

\*\*The camp is asking us to make a payment 2 weeks prior to our camp week. **This does not mean that at the 2-week mark no one else can register.** You are able to register until the day camp starts and you can pay the remaining balance of your final payment when you arrive. ## Helpful Information to Know

Grand Canyon State Baptist Camp maintains an emphasis on conduct and attire. We reserve the right to ask and expect any camper to change their behavior or clothing if deemed inappropriate.

**Bring:** Bible, notebook, pen, flashlight, bedding/sleeping bag (single bunk beds), towels, washcloths, toiletries, reusable water bottle, good shoes for activities, and other personal items. You will need money for snacks. Jackets or sweatshirts are helpful for cool evenings and mornings.

**Do Not Bring:** Cell phones, video games, knives, or firearms. No smoking. No pets.

**Dating:** No physical contact is allowed between campers of opposite genders. All campers are required to stay in supervised areas.

**Guys Clothing:** Loose-fitting, knee-length shorts, jeans/pants are acceptable for recreational activities and morning services. Colored, knee-length shorts and T-shirt must be worn for water games. Nice, casual clothing (no shorts) with a collared shirt should be worn to the evening services. All shirts must have sleeves: no tank tops. Avoid wearing clothing with inappropriate advertisement.

**Girls Clothing:** Loose-fitting, knee-length shorts, jeans/pants are acceptable for recreational activities and morning services. Leggings/jeggings are not permitted. Shirts must have sleeves (no tank tops or spaghetti strap tops). Avoid wearing clothing with inappropriate advertisement and logos. Colored, knee-length shorts and T-shirt must be worn for water games. Casual skirts or dresses (no shorts or pants) must come to the middle of the knee and are to be worn to the evening services.
